

What is a Serial?

(From AACR2 & LCRI12.0A)

The publication must have all of the following criteria:

- Issued in successive parts
- Bears numbering or dates
- Is intended to be continued indefinitely

Toughest Decision

Is it a serial or a monograph?

- Look at the definition of a serial. Does your publication fit the three criteria?
- Does each issue have a distinctive title? If so, you may have a monographic series or set.

Grey Areas in Determining Seriality

(See LCRI12.0A)

1. Conference publications -- serial treatment limited to ongoing publications that do not have unique titles and/or are not part of a numbered monographic series.
2. Loose-leaf publications -- The determination of successive parts is based on the base volume, not the updates; a base volume with interfiled pages is considered to be a monograph.
3. Publications that lack numbering or date but indicate that they will continue regularly -- Usually treated as monographs unless future issues pick up numbering or date.
4. Irregularly or infrequently published titles -- These titles are revised or updates as the need arises and are not intended to continue indefinitely. Textbooks are a good example.
5. Short-duration publications -- Progress reports of short-term projects and newsletters produced from a single event are not considered serials because they are not intended to continue indefinitely.

How to determine that your one issue is a serial if it doesn't obviously fit the serial criteria:

- Has a stated frequency.
- Has a prominent date.
- The editor explains that you have the first issue of a serial.

Common sources of information are the foreword, introduction, colophon, accompanying correspondence, the Web, and the best source of information of all--talking with the publisher on the phone.

If in doubt, catalog as a monograph and see if another issue appears.

How CONSER Guidelines Differ From the Rules

- 5xx notes are listed in numerical order, with the exception that fields 533 and 539 are input following all other notes. Prior to June 1996, the 538 field was input as the first 5xx field for computer files.
- In field 260, the date of publication is not included if the first or last issue of the serial is not in hand. (AACR2 1.4F7 is not applied)

Challenging Things about AV Serials

- Dates. Often lacking or confusing.
- Frequency. Often lacking or hard to determine.
- Which rules apply? Which ones are dominant?
- What note goes where? What notes do I include?

Challenging Things about Internet Serials

- Same problems as other audiovisual serials (confusing dates, frequency, etc.)
- Linking relationships are difficult to determine
- Do you really have a serial or something else???
- What do you do about the holdings?
- And you thought printed serials change information frequently!

Uniform Titles

Commonly used in serials for collocation and differentiation.

Notes

Guiding principles:

- Include all notes that apply
- Remember: you're cataloging the whole title, not just one issue

Linking Relationships: Title Changes, Supplements, Other Physical Formats OH MY!

Guiding principles:

- Catalog titles separately if they have distinct title, subject and/or numbering differences.
- Minor changes can be noted on one record.

When in doubt, add note and/or variant title to record and wait to see if future issues define a distinctive title.

Subject Analysis

Guiding principle:

- Assign headings for the whole work rather than the individual piece.

Except for monographic and highly irregular serials, subject headings generally are subdivided by \$x Periodicals or other standard form subdivisions (e.g. Directories). See *LCSH Manual* under "Periodicals."

The Future of Serials Cataloging

- international Conference on the Future of AACR and Models of Seriality
- Alternate approaches to information access to serials, including UTK's Hooks to Holdings (H2H) Project

Notes

Cataloging Examples:

Used to illustrate the points on the previous handouts/overheads and provide discussion.

Arranged in order of conventional AV serials (starting with microforms) to new strategies for dealing with AV serials (e.g. Internet serials, UTK's Hooks to Holdings project).

The "American Political Science Review" is a JSTOR title that illustrates both CONSER's traditional separate record approach and its experimental one record approach for cataloging online versions of printed serials.

The Hooks to Holdings (H2H) project at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville is an alternative to cataloging titles from aggregator databases such as Dow Jones and Lexis-Nexis. Vendor-provided information is automatically converted to a brief **MARC** record that resides in UTK's Ameritech Horizon catalog. These records are automatically identified by purchase order number. On a regular basis, the records are replaced by an updated list from the vendor.

Advantages: very little maintenance on the part of UTK staff. provides users with version options from the brief-record catalog display (see alternative GMDs on "title browse search" handout), URL in 856 allows user to link to title (eventually), allows links from articles in citation databases (e.g. ABI Inform) to catalog based on ISSN.

Disadvantages: URL in catalog record links to the main web page for the service rather than the specific title, the only access point is the title (can be searched by browse or keyword searches)

Discussion Examples:

The group examined two Internet titles and discussed whether or not these are serials. Do they fit the three criteria of a serial? 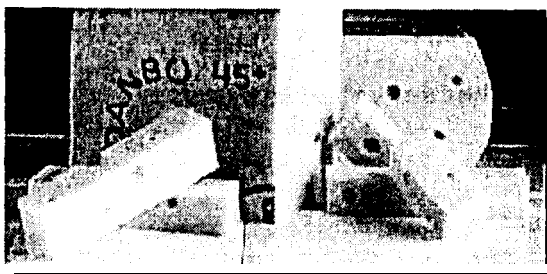

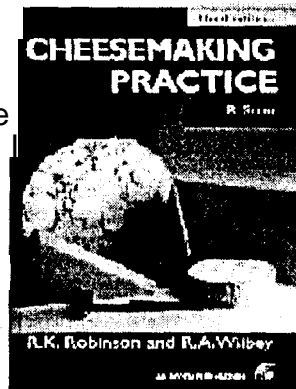
